## About Awana

Awana is an international, non-denominational, Bible-centered youth organization providing weekly clubs for children. It operates through thousands of local churches that share Awana's vision for evangelical outreach and effective discipleship of young people. The goals of Awana may be summarized by these words from their pledge, "[Our] goal is to reach boys and girls with the Gospel of Christ, and train them to serve Him."

Awana provides a structured and disciplined program of activities that includes games, Bible lessons, scripture memorization, singing, and awards. The word "Awana" is an acrostic that comes from the first letters of this phrase in II Timothy 2:15, "Approved Workmen are Not Ashamed."

- 100% of the children who come to Awana hear the gospel
- Over 30 thousand churches in over 100 denominations have Awana programs
- Awana has clubs in 119 countries
- Over 2 million children are reached with the gospel each week around the world

- Preschool – Learning respect for God and the authority of His word
- K-2<sup>nd</sup> –Building a Biblical knowledge base
- 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> – Learning how to live in God’s grace and show grace to others
- Middle School – Learning to follow the calling and will of God
- High School – Developing perspective to trust in God’s sovereignty over all things

By completing all levels of the Awana program, your child will have:

- Read all 66 books of the Bible at least once
- Memorized over 800 Bible verses
- Awana Kids = Christ Centered Adults

# **Behavior and Discipline Policy**

Clubbers are expected to behave in a manner that is conducive to learning, both for themselves and others. Clubbers are also expected to have a respectful attitude to Awana leaders and staff.

## The 5 Count

Used by the Club Leaders to get the group's attention. Leader counts, "1-2-3-4-5" and expects clubbers to be quiet and ready to listen.

## The 3 Strikes


Used by the Awana Staff to address individual clubbers' misbehavior.

1. When a clubber acts inappropriately after gentle reminders, the clubber is given one strike.
2. If a clubber continues to create disturbances and disobey leaders, the clubber is given second strike. At this point the leader will redirect behavior and make any environmental changes that need to be made to help the child get back on track.  
(ie. moving the clubber to another seat)
3. If a clubber fails to correct his/her behavior and continues to create problems then he/she will be given a third strike. This will result in an immediate suspension. If the parents are not available the child will sit with an approved adult until the end of club. The clubber may be given an opportunity to return to club the following week, but only after the Commander and Director meet with the parent(s).

If this becomes a recurring problem additional measures may be discussed between the Director and the parents. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's Director or Commander.

## Handbooks

This year all T&T clubbers will be in the same handbook, Evidence of Grace. The clubbers will be working the same sections together as a group week to week. All clubbers will also need to complete the Start Zone before working sections in the handbook.



### HANDBOOK COMPLETION AWARDS

Each T&T child that completes a Handbook will receive a Book Completion award at the Year End Awards Ceremony.

## PASSING SECTIONS

There are four parts to completing a handbook section each week;

### ***Start Here – Explore – Memorize – Review***



Clubbers will need to complete each part to get the section sign off as complete.

### **EXTRA CREDIT (to earn Extra Credit Emblems)**



Clubbers can earn up to four silver emblems and four gold emblems per year. These sections are located within each lesson. They may be completed anytime throughout the year. They do not count towards completion of the handbook.

## **Rewards and Incentives**

### ***Mid-year Plateau***

At the halfway point of the year, January 10<sup>th</sup>, clubbers will have the opportunity to be invited to a plateau celebration. The goal is to be current with sections completed matching the lesson schedule. If a clubber is not quite there, absences and date entering the year will be evaluated to determine eligibility.

### ***Handbook Party***

There is also an incentive for completing their handbook. If a clubber completes their handbook for the year, they will be invited to the year end handbook party.

## **Tips on How Parents Can Help**

1. Please bring your child to club on time (Check-in starts at 6:10pm). Pick up your child at 8:15 p.m.
2. Make sure your child wears the uniform shirt to club. Proper display of clubbers awards contributes greatly to their sense of achievement.
3. Help your child prepare for Club each week, learning handbook material at home. Children enjoy and excel in Awana in direct proportion to parental interest. Take the time during the week to work with your child on the handbook activities and memory verses.
4. Visit club anytime. Your child will be thrilled to have you take part in club activities.
5. Encourage your child each step of the way. Learning is hard work!

Clubbers are encouraged to perform home activities like extra chores to earn money to provide financial assistance to national and international Awana clubs that cannot afford handbooks, uniforms, and other items needed for an Awana club. We will be supporting clubs around the world.

Leaders and clubbers work together in small groups discussing the Biblical concept for that week and reviewing the memory verse


8:00-8:15 Fast Track (East Wing)
